Impact of spending 2017-2018 will be reviewed in term 6 2018			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improvement in the quality of PE teaching through 1:1 CPD. Planning resources provided with these sessions have supported class teachers in delivering PE sessions. The two new PE Leads have attended PSSP meetings to action plan for further developments in PE provision across the school. PE leads have supported other members of staff with peer teaching to further enhance CPD for PE. Intra-school competitions have been introduced to increase the opportunities for children to participate in sporting activities or events. Increase sporting/competitive opportunities have been provided through the Plymouth School Sports Partnership. The school has achieved the Bronze School Games Award. The school participated in Junior Ten Tors Challenge, a teacher was trained as a Moorland Leader so that this can continue in subsequent years. The school provides a range of extra-curricular clubs to provide increased opportunities for children to participate in sports. Activity days introduced children to new sports such as cricket and archery. Year 6 Children – Swimming 83% can swim 25m or over.
