## Power Station Visit



On Thursday 21st March, 14 children were chosen to go on a trip to the Langage Power Station. These children were chosen for their keen interest in STEM subjects. with many attending STEM club weekly. On arrival, we were shown into the amazing Discovery Centre which was equipped with many interactive STEM games and

hands-on activities. After a tour of the inside of the energy power plant (complete with safety helmets, clipboards, and goggles), we had the chance to explore activities such as powering a TV with pedal power or programming a robot in a sequence.
