

10am - 1pm Thursday 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th August Free to attend but booking is advised.



Times Tables Rockstar Event

On Wednesday 3rd July, two boys from Year 4, Dan and Ty, represented Oakwood at the annual Times Tables Rockstars Red Carpet Event. The boys arrived at school in their Rockstar inspired outfits ready to take on the competition. The morning started with six intense rounds involving sixty-four children from schools across Plymouth. Each round was a battle between four children to be the fastest to answer 100 multiplication questions. The two boys got off to a great





start with Dan winning the round and Ty coming second. After the six rounds, the competitors had to add up all the points they had won during the six rounds and the top twenty-eight children went into the quarter finals. Ty did very well and was in the top half, but he just missed out by a few points. Fortunately, Dan had done just enough to make it into the quarter finals. The first six rounds were completed on paper, whereas the finals were played on the Ipads. Dan, who is our fastest Rockstar player in the school, was feeling confident he could win. The crowd was getting very excited when the first few players managed to

answer close to 100 correct multiplications in one minute. It was finally Dan's turn to play in front of the crowd and after watching the first few quarter finals, he was feeling nervous but confident. Dan performed brilliantly by answering 117 correct multiplication questions in one minute. The crowd was shocked at this speed, and it meant he went through to the semifinals. After winning his semi-final comfortably, Dan was ready to compete against the fastest children in the final. Many of the finalist were older than Dan, but that did not scare him. The seven-finalist sat



in front of the crowd ready to battle to become Plymouth's Rock God. By the end of the minute, second place had answered 99 multiplication questions correctly. Unbelievably, Dan was the fastest by far with a ridiculous score of 134 in one minute. Yes, 134! With this victory, Dan was the overall winner of the event and became Plymouth's Rock God for 2019! We are incredibly proud of both Dan and Ty for doing so well in the competition and representing Oakwood in a fantastic manner. They have worked incredibly hard to improve their multiplication knowledge this year by regularly playing Times Table Rockstars. Is there anyone in Oakwood that can challenge Dan to be the next Rock God? He has set the challenge, who will take him on?

Hula hoop and Zumba Workshops



At Oakwood we have been throwing ourselves into trying new and exciting things that help to get our heart rate up to stay healthy and active. This term we were lucky enough to experience Hula Hooping and Zumba.

We had an instructor visit our schools and teach us all (teachers included) how to do some snazzy tricks with a



hula hoop, tips on how to keep the hoop spinning and all of the different body parts we can use. Children had a fantastic time moving their hips, arms, legs and ankles to music trying to keep the hoop from touching the floor. I was so impressed with the rhythm and repetition that all of the children displayed, we were all determined to challenge our own personal best time before the hoop hit the floor. At 5:15am the team met and travelled the 2 hour journey to the event, picking up fellow competitors from Beechwood, Weston Mill and St Budeaux. Making



good time, Oakwheels (this years team name) arrived first out of all 39 teams. The Gazebo went up, Go Kart came off the truck and our team colours were deployed. This year the team had worked on a portfolio for the race (a massive thanks to Lisa Darcy) and along with signing up that went in for judging also. The team were ready!

With the smallest team at the event, and the only school in Plymouth (out of the 5 going) only running one kart the children had to decide which of the 6 drag runs they were going to do. 
ideas unities as the possibilities are endless.
