



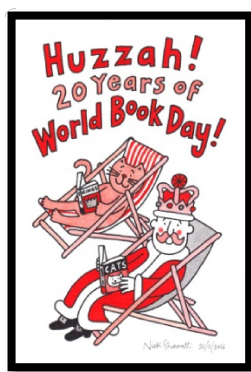
## Oakwood Reading Corner 10
